# TODAY'S JUDGES, EMCEES, AND HOST DIRECTORS

## JUDGES

**Michael Akers** is in his ninth year as Director of Bands and his second year as Performing Arts Department Chair at North Central High School where he is responsible for overseeing all department and band activities and serves as the primary conductor for Wind Ensemble and Jazz Ensemble I. Mike holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education with an emphasis in Trumpet Performance from Indiana University and a Master of Science Degree in Education from Purdue University. He recently completed his secondary education administrative licensing through Purdue. Prior to his appointment at North Central, he served as an Associate Instructor in the Department of Bands at Purdue University for two years, as well as four years as the Band Director at NorthWood High School and Nappanee Middle School in Nappanee, IN. In addition to his teaching duties, Mike is known for his skills as a guest conductor, adjudicator, trumpet player, and as a composer/arranger for the Lorenz Corporation. He is an active member in the Indiana Bandmaster's Association, Indiana State School Association, Kappa Kappa Psi, Tau Beta Sigma, Phi Beta Mu, International Association of Jazz Educators, and Music Educator's National Conference. He currently serves on the board for the Indiana State School Music Association, and Indiana Bandmasters' Association. Mike is married to his wife Christi and has two daughters named Elizabeth and Emma.

**Dr. Madlen Batchvarova** is the conductor of Concert Choir, and Chamber Singers, the premiere choral ensembles of Hanover College. She also teaches conducting and voice, and music history. Born in Sofia, Bulgaria, Dr. Batchvarova holds a BM in music education in piano performance and solfege from the Academy of Music and Dance Art in Plovdiv, and an MM in choral conducting from Georgia State University. Dr. Batchvarova completed her Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Choral Conducting from the University of Alabama where she studied conducting with Drs. Sandra Willetts, and Gerald Welker.

Dr. Batchvarova made her debut as a conductor with the Plovdiv Academy Women's Choir of Bulgaria. She has conducted the ensemble in concerts in the National Palace of Culture in Sofia, Bulgaria, the French Cultural Institute in Plovdiv, as well as the International Choral Festival in Preveza, Greece. Dr. Batchvarova has also performed as a singer in the Plovdiv Academy Women's Choir under the direction of its founder and artistic director Mr. Krikor Tchetyan. The group has made concert tours and radio broadcast recordings in the U.S., Canada, Germany, Italy, Belgium, Greece, and Israel among others.

Since her arrival in the United States in 1995, Dr. Batchvarova has performed as a singer with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Chorus, and the Chamber Chorus under the direction of Maestro Robert Shaw. Some highlights of her participation with the ensemble include a Grammy Award for the Best Choral Performance in 1998, Carnegie Hall performances of Bach's *Mass in B Minor*, and Brahms's *Requiem* and participation at the Opening Ceremony of the Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta.

Dr. Batchvarova is also a successful pianist. Some highlights of her accompanying career include the First Prize in the Competition for Czech and Slovak Music in Varna, Bulgaria, leading to concert engagements at Community Artist Series at Hanover College, she performed along with pianist Kimm Hollis in a "Music for Two Pianos" concert.



In addition to her demanding teaching and performing schedule, Dr. Batchvarova maintains an active international career. During the summer of 2002, she presented workshops on conducting and performance practices at the Thracian University in Bulgaria, and was a member of the jury at the international Choral Festival in Preveza, Greece. She is the Ethnic and Multicultural Perspectives Chair of the Executive Board of the Indiana Choral Directors' Association, and is active as a guest clinician and adjudicator around the state and the nation. Dr. Batchvarova's biography was included in the 2004 edition of the Marquis *Who is Who in America*.

**Michael Crandall** is in his ninth year as Choral Director at Teays Valley High School in Ohio. Mr. Crandall is a graduate of The Ohio State University, where he studied under James Gallagher and Hillary Apfelstadt. He has done additional studies at Heidelberg College. Since his arrival at Teays Valley High School, enrollment in the choir department has increased over 200 percent. He currently directs a program of five choirs, consisting of the Symphonic Choir, Men's Chorus, Women's Chorus, Concert Choir, and the Show Choir, "Prominent Rendition", with a total enrollment of 300 students. Symphonic Choir, Men's Chorus, and Women's Chorus consistently receive superior ratings at OMEA State Contest. The award winning Show Choir, "Prominent Rendition", has been named Grand Champions 22 times over the last five years. Prominent Rendition was also selected to perform at the 2001 and 2003 OMEA State Conventions. He has twice served as Co-musical Director of the Ohio Honors Chorale, an ensemble of advanced high school musicians who have made bi-annual concert tours through Europe. Past tours have taken him to England, Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands, Poland, Austria, and Slovak Republic. He has been an adjudicator and clinician for choirs and competitions in Indiana, Ohio, and West Virginia. He is an active member of OMEA, OCDA, MENC, and ACDA, as well as a member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity.

**LeAnn Haggard** is a graduate of Ball State University with a Bachelor's Degree in Physical Education, Health Education, and Dance. She was a member of the Ball State Ballet, Modern Dance, and Folk Dance Companies and performed in many college and civic theatre productions. She owned LeAnn's School of Dance in Shelbyville, Indiana for 18 years, teaches classes in tap, ballet, jazz, modern, clogging, and ballroom. LeAnn worked with the Indiana Pacer organization for three years as the Jr. Pacemate Choreographer. She is currently a full-time teacher at North Central High School here in Indianapolis where she designs extensive choreography for show choirs, dance teams, and musicals. She is also an adjunct faculty member of Indiana University / Purdue University - Indianapolis where she teaches tap, jazz, ballet, musical theatre, and ballroom. In November, 2004, she received the Dance Educator of the Year Award which was presented by the Indiana Association of Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance.

**Bill McKinley** is a professional actor, singer, dancer, choreographer, director, arranger and choreographer. On stage, he has appeared Off-Broadway, at the Actors Theatre of Louisville, the Indiana Repertory Theatre, Starlight Musicals, and Pittsburgh's Civic Light Opera. His film credits include the Disney film POCHAHONTAS and MULAN, and his television work includes many network appearances as well as hundreds of commercials both on-camera and off- as a singer and voice-over artist for McDonalds, Coca-Cola, Cadillac, Subway, Buick, Chevrolet, Pizza Hut, and Wendy's, to name a few. Bill has two solo CDs: "Everything Possible" and "The Closing Of The Year", each of which garnered both critical and popular acclaim. His cabaret and concert work has taken him all over the world, and he appears regularly at some of New York City's top nightclubs. Originally from Muncie, Indiana, Bill received his formal training at the University of Cincinnati College/Conservatory of Music and at Wright State University of Dayton, Ohio, but considers some of his best training during the years he spent performing and choreographing as a member of the North Central *Counterpoints*, under the direction of Robert Critzer and Beatrice Thomas. Bill took the Counterpoints to their first-ever show choir competition (Bishop Luers, 1979), and, as choreographer for Pat Wiehe, helped win their first championship title (Central Sound Classic, 1987). As a singer and activist, Bill makes frequent appearances on behalf of human rights and AIDS-related causes, and he had the honor of being chosen as the only singer for the National Candlelight Vigil for Matthew Shepard, singing on the steps of our nation's Capitol. Bill currently



resides in New York City, just a block away from Times Square.

He has sung at Carnegie Hall with the Oratorio Society of New York, and in France as a soloist with The Festival Singers under the direction of Robert Shaw. Rickards was the soloist in the American premiere performance of Michael Nyman's *Self-Laudatory Hymn of Inanna and Her Omnipotence* with the Netherlands Wind Ensemble at Lincoln Center's Alice Tully Hall. He has recorded for Chanticleer, Decca, Dorian, Four Winds, Gothic, Harmonia Mundi, Koch, Newport Classics, Smithsonian, and Teldec the labels. Rickards can also be heard on the Naxos label where he has recorded two solo albums with lutenist Dorothy Linell of the songs of John Dowland and Thomas Campion.

Steven currently lives in Indianapolis where he teaches singing at Butler University and the University of Indianapolis. He sings regularly with The Choir of Men and Boys at Christ Church Cathedral, and with Paul Hillier's Theatre of Voices. He received his doctorate from Florida State University.
